The Prison Radio Association is a charity that has **revolutionised prisoner communication**. The multi award-winning organisation, established in 2006, promotes and supports the development of prison radio projects across the country. It also developed, launched and runs the ground-breaking radio station, **National Prison Radio**. Launched in 2009, National Prison Radio is the world's first and only national radio station for prisoners. It is a by prisoner, for prisoner service, with programming inspired, developed, produced and presented by prisoners working alongside a small team of committed professional radio producers.

National Prison Radio supports prisoners through their sentences and aims to **reduce reoffending**. It helps prisoners face up to the effects their actions have had on themselves, their families, their victims and society as a whole. National Prison Radio provides vital information and support to help its listeners turn their backs on crime, and rebuild their lives in preparation for release.

The Prison Radio Association works in **partnership** with a range of statutory and voluntary bodies to create lifechanging programming for National Prison Radio. Programmes alert listeners to services that support rehabilitation and resettlement. National Prison Radio takes the messages of other organisations and literally amplifies them; providing prisoners with crucial information and driving up referral rates to essential services.

November to December 2014

A campaign to encourage prisoners to take part in the *Six Book Challenge* to improve literacy skills across prisons

An impressive 68% of National Prison Radio listeners heard the campaign

28% of those who heard it took action*'I completed the Six Book Challenge''It encouraged me to visit the library'*

Prison Reform Trust March to December 2014

A campaign to raise awareness of the rights of prisoners on remand

More than three-quarters (76%) of prisoners heard the campaign, with 60% of prisoners agreeing that adverts contained information of which they were previously unaware

20% of those who heard it took action

National Careers Service January to March 2014

A campaign to raise awareness of support provided by the *National Careers Service*

Fewer than 4 in 10 prisoners were aware of the National Careers Service before the campaign. This increased to almost 9 in 10 after the campaign

1 in 10 prisoners had spoken to a National Careers Service Adviser before campaign, rising to 3 in 10 after

Most respondents viewed the radio advertising as 'informative' and 'helpful'


The Butler Trust May 2014

A campaign to encourage prisoners to nominate prison staff for a *Butler Trust Award*

The response was **unprecedented**, with a **600% increase** in nominations from prisoners compared to previous years.

'She's been there every single time I've needed her. I'd just like her to get an award to show that the lads do care and that she does make a big difference'

'When we told people we were going to try to get prisoners to nominate staff for the Butler Trust Awards there was real scepticism about the likely response. We needn't have worried. National Prison Radio helped us reach our target audience and explain what we wanted and why. The <u>response was overwhelming</u>, with well over 200 prisoners answering our call!' Listeners' impressions of National Prison Radio

2014 Prisoner Communications

- **5,813:** letters sent from prisoners to National Prison Radio in 2014 (up from 5,288 in 2013)
- **1,834:** requests and messages of support from prisoners' friends and loved ones (up from 1,337 in 2013)
- Prisoners in **99 different prisons** contacted National Prison Radio by telephone or letter (up from 74 in 2013)

2014 On Air

- **475:** prisoners contributed to programmes and campaigns on NPR (up from 441 in 2013)
- **113:** hours of original content featured on National Prison Radio, that was recorded in prisons without a Prison Radio Association studio (up from 92 in 2013)
- **92:** prisoners worked as radio producers alongside Prison Radio Association staff



- **41:** former prisoners featured on National Prison Radio's *Outside In* programme in partnership with BBC Outreach
- **12**: **BBC radio producers** volunteered with the Prison Radio Association to produce the *Outside In* programme alongside former prisoners as part of the charity's partnership with **BBC Outreach**
